While Dr. Johnsie Cogman (our District Superintendent) is continuing to act as our interim pastor until then, we have been so blessed to have Rev. Katy continue as our "pulpit pastor" through Easter. Beginning in April, St. Matthew's will have a "preaching rotation" of several folks until July. Additionally, our MIssions group has received sanitation supplies (soap, sanitizer, etc.) from Mission Central, and is working with several groups to ensure they are properly distributed to those who need them the most.

Financial Status

Additional mortgage reduction donations have been received, and the outstanding balance has decreased to \$421K. (See more details elsewhere in this *Circuit Rider.*) St. Matthew's has applied for and received a second Federal PPP (COVID-relief) loan for approximately \$55K! The Early Education Center applied for forgiveness of their first PPP loan, and is awaiting determination. It is anticipated that the EEC will be able to continue to make the normal rent payments to the church while operating at reduced capacity.

No unusual expenses were incurred during February, but offerings remain significantly under budget for the year. Apportionments and all other invoices have been paid. No funds were removed from the investment account in February.

Thank you for your continued support, which enables St. Matthew's to continue to function during this challenging time.








Social Justice: LGBT+ Community Breaking Down the Acronym: I

This month, we'll be talking about the I in LGBTQIA: intersex. Intersex people are individuals born with reproductive and/or sexual anatomy that do not fit the conventional definitions of



"male" or "female". These variations can include variations in chromosomes, hormones, genetic development, and visible or internal anatomy. Although people are born intersex, some traits may not develop until puberty. Other traits, like chromosomal variations, may not ever be discovered until the individual in question has already passed and their body undergoes an autopsy.

This particular part of the acronym is an extremely complex topic. To understand intersex people, it is immensely helpful to understand the science behind the intersex identity. First and foremost, we need to get rid of the idea that there are only two biological sexes. The two *most common combinations* of sexual chromosomes and reproductive attributes in humans are what we call "male" and "female," but we know now that they are far from the only combinations that occur in the human genome, and that chromosomes are not the only genetic factor that determines biological sex.

EEC Corner — MSDE Re-Accreditation

St. Matthew's Church Family,

We proudly announce that the EEC will be working towards state re-accreditation over the next few months. For those of you unfamiliar with this term, it's like seeking a seal of approval from a higher governing body, in this case the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE). Based on **best practices** acknowledged in the field of early childhood education, MSDE has developed a set of standards and expectations for preschools and child care centers to strive toward.

Accreditation is a two-year process that begins with a **self-study**. The self-study is a reflective period where teachers, parents, and administrators use an assessment tool to reveal strengths and weaknesses in our program. From this phase of the process, we will develop a **self-improvement plan** in coordination with an MSDE mentor. Once changes are made and our improvement goals are met, typically we would invite the MSDE accreditation team to visit our school and make its final assessment. However, this year will be different, as is most everything else, and visits will occur virtually.

One of the most challenging, but exciting, parts of this program is the fact that it is cyclical. We go through this process every three years! It is a daunting and rigorous road, but we truly believe that if we are to grow life-long learners among our students, we must actively and affirmatively become partners in that process. Learn and grow. Grow and learn!

We are also involved in another MSDE program initiative called **Maryland Excels**. While our teachers are preparing their rooms for a potential virtual visit, they are also gathering their professional development plans for review. The goal of Maryland Excels is to improve the quality of early childhood education in Maryland through improving the professional development and education of its teachers. This process is called **credentialing** and all our teachers are required to participate in this program. Once part of this program, teachers must complete a preset number of credit hours in 5 different domains of learning every year. Annually, they resubmit their portfolios of professional development work for review, so again, this is an ongoing process to reinforce that self-improvement is not a destination, but a journey.

This is a lot of information to digest and keep track of, but at the core of our professional development is our desire to do our best at providing the community's children with an amazing early childhood education experience. With our teachers' hard work and determination, and the church's continued support, we will quickly meet these goals!



Finance Report: St. Matthew's Finances at a Glance




ST. MATTHEW'S FINANCES IN GRAPHS (February 2021)




GOAL: Operating income should be greater than or at least equal to operating expenses
