St. Matthew's Administrative Council Report

Pastor Vacancy

With great anticipation, Rev. JW Park, will begin his time with us on July 1. Dr. Johnsie Cogman (our District Superintendent) will continue as our interim pastor until then, and we are blessed to have a group of preachers filling our pulpit through June (see page 1). Catalyst/360 Initiative

Initial actions involve the creation of a diverse worship support team to reimagine and build on our current worship experience as we work to redefine SMUMC for the future!

Missions/Outreach

Dan Blades and Bob Fuller picked up 200 boxes each of hand sanitizer and soap from Mission Central, and all have been distributed. See page 7 for details.

Christian Formation/Family Ministry

ASP is scheduled for July 25-31 with the destination TBD. Look for separate notifications for meeting information and additional details.

Dr. Cogman will be hosting two new Bible studies beginning in May, on Monday and Tuesday evenings. The study books will be *Really Bad Girls of the Bible* by Liz Curtis Higgs and *Romans* by N.T. Wright. More information can be found on page 4.

Trustees

The Trustees have approved two revenue opportunities for others to use our facilities. Neither of these activities impacts our non-profit status, but

both result in monthly rental income for SMUMC:

- A Beta House resident who lost her teaching job during COVID will be using our church kitchen during some daytime weekday hours for some of the assembly work associated with her baking business.
- The Acton Academy of Patuxent will be utilizing room 222/224 for their one-room schoolhouse from September-June. Contract review is currently underway. Other activities scheduled for this space will be moved to avoid conflict.

Financial Status

Offerings were \$68.9k for March, which is \$18.7k over budget for the month, thanks to a generous \$20k one-time donation. YTD total income is \$184.9k, which is \$5.2k under budget. Total expenses for March were \$67.3k, which is \$4k over budget. YTD total expense is \$182.4k, which is \$7.7k under budget. There was an operating gain of \$13.6k for March, with a YTD gain of \$2.5k. Additional cost savings will be recognized with a new 5-year copier lease beginning in April. YTD the investment account balance is up \$34.9k. No funds have been transferred from the investment account this year. The mortgage balance decreased \$71.4k in March to \$348.6k. It will be below \$300k by the end of April. Copies of the March financial reports are available in the Narthex.

Thank you for your continued support, which enables St. Matthew's to continue to function during this challenging time. As St. Matthew's is reopening for in-person worship on May 2, I look forward to seeing you there!


I miss you immensely and pray for you often.

Christian Book Club




The Christian Book Club will meet on Tuesday, May 18, at 7 p.m. via Zoom.

Two New Book Studies Offered in May


Dr. Johnsie Cogman will lead St. Matthew's in two new book studies via Zoom in the month of May. Please register in advance for each study using the links below.

Eight of the Bible's most notorious females strut across the pages of *Really Bad Girls of the Bible* with troubles that still hit home in the twenty-first century.






Book: Romans by N.T. Wright




Social Justice Coffee Chats








Easter Eggs!



Finance Report: St. Matthew's Finances at a Glance




ST. MATTHEW'S FINANCES IN GRAPHS (March 2021)




GOAL: Operating income should be greater than or at least equal to operating expenses
