Farewell and Welcome

Turning the page on the calendar to July marks a change in leadership for St. Matthew's. Our District Superintendent, Rev. Dr. Johnsie W. Cogman ("Dr. C"), has led us as Interim Pastor since January. Thanks to the return to in-person worship, we could thank her personally for steering St. Matthew's through the uncertainty of



the gradual return from the pandemic shutdown and leadership transition.

Picking up on this metaphor, Lay Servant Gemina Archer-Davies presented Dr. C with a model ship at the end of the worship service on June 27.

On July 1, Rev. JongWoo Park (JW) will start his appointment as St. Matthew's Senior Pastor. In his Pastoral Pondering on p. 2, JW

Rev. Park's Pastoral Pondering



Dear St. Matthew's family,

My name is JW Park, your new pastor as of July 1. I am so happy to come to St. Matthew's. It is my joy and privilege to serve God with you, so I am looking forward to meeting all of you and getting to know each other.

God is calling us to serve. I believe that what we do and where we go depends on God. After eight years of serving as a District Superintendent, God sent me to St. Matthew's, and I said yes to the appointment with a glad heart. I served God faithfully during the last eight years and I will dedicate myself to

serving God at St. Matthew's in the years to come.

I came from a non-believing family. I accepted Christ when I was in college, so I understand those who do not believe in Christ. I believe that my experience as a non-believer in my youth helps me effectively bring new people to Christ. My father served in the Korean Army for over 35 years, retiring as a major general, and then serving in the presidential cabinet. My mother was a school teacher. I have three older sisters and one brother, making me the baby of the family. [I don't think I am spoiled rotten, but I'll let you be the judge of that.] I came to the U.S. to finish my MBA, but God called me to the ordained ministry while I studied. This year marks my 29th year in the ordained ministry. My wife, HiRho, is also an ordained elder in the Baltimore Washington Conference, and has been appointed to Bethesda UMC, in Bethesda. She and I have one daughter, Felicia, who is getting married to Jesse.

I came to St. Matthew's to walk with you in our journey together, bringing healing and harmony. I am here to care for you and love you. We have suffered long enough from the pandemic, and we are more than ready to come back in full force to be the body of Christ. I can sense that God is doing something new with us as the prophet Isaiah says,

I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. (Isaiah 43:19, NRSV)

I am very excited to serve Christ with you and witness what God can do with us.

What does this mean to St. Matthew's?

Gemina will serve St. Matthew's in one or more of the following functions:

- Provide leadership, assistance, and support to church programs.
- Lead meetings for prayer, training, study, and discussion when requested by the pastor.
- Conduct, or assist in conducting, services of worship, preach the Word, or give addresses when requested by the pastor.
- Work with appropriate committees and teams which provide congregational and community leadership or foster caring ministries.
- Assist in the distribution of the elements of Holy

Communion upon request by the pastor.

• Teach the Scriptures, doctrine, organization, and ministries of The United Methodist Church.

Is this the same as a Lay Leader?

No, a Lay Servant could be appointed as Lay Leader; however, a Lay Leader may or may not not have credentials to be a Lay Servant. A Lay Leader is appointed by the Nominations and Leadership Development Team and elected for a 3-year term at Church Conference.

Our current Lay Leaders are Gary Allen and Marian Eisinger. Our next election for Lay Leaders will be at our upcoming 2021 Church Conference this Fall. If you're interested in becoming a Lay Servant or serving as a Lay Leader, please talk to our new pastor, Rev. Park.

A Lay Leader may also be the Lay Member of the Annual Conference. Responsibilities of both positions include interpreting the actions and programs of the annual conference and the general church, and communicating the vision and needs of the local church to the Annual Conference and general church. These two roles are complementary, yet there are responsibilities unique to each role. The lay leader has a primary focus of linking the local church and community. The lay member of annual conference has a primary focus of linking the local church to the connectional United Methodist Church and God's worldwide church.

Panel Discussion on UM Charter for Racial Justice – July 10



On Saturday, July 10, from 7 to 9 p.m. a panel discussion will be held on Zoom about the Charter, discussing racist language, what it is, and how it affects us on a daily basis. Mission u – Intergenerational Education Opportunity – July 23-24

The theme for the United Methodist Women's annual Mission u program this year is "Learning Together for the Transformation of the World." The inter-generational educational opportunities planned will examine finding peace amid the anxiety of today's world, the culture of violence that

impacts our children in and out of schools, and how we as God's people deepen our moral witness and respond faithfully to events.

Mission u will be held virtually on Friday and Saturday, July 23 - 24. There will be a variety of sessions and activities, including "Finding Peace in an Anxious World" for adults, "Managing Anxiety" for youth in grades 7-12, and, on Saturday afternoon, a panel



discussion of *Pushout - Criminalization of Black Girls in Schools* for all attendees. *Pushout* is a book and a related video (available free on <u>Kanopy.com</u> with your library card) about how young Black women are stigmatized and mischaracterized, especially in schools, which then negatively affects their education.

Registration is open now and the cost is \$25 for adults and free for youth. Complete information can be found here.

faces of so many who appreciated her messages earlier this year.


Administrative Council Report

News from Our Missionaries and International Partners

Helen Roberts, Liberia, General Education and Ministry: Liberia Education Update February 2021

St. Matthew School, Liberia:

• **Scholarships:** 46 students were given a Bowie scholarship to attend St. Matthew School this year. See St. Matthew School Scholarship Update and Greetings March 2021 for more information.

• Science Laboratory Update:

- ► 146 students are currently taking science. See them at work in this <u>March 2021 video of science</u> students demonstrating electricity video.
- Earlier this year, the Liberian Department of General Education's Science Department observed, graded, and praised the students at St. Matthew School. It was the only United Methodist school with students who passed the Liberian national science examination; in fact, all of their students who took the national examination successfully passed. Helen Roberts was impressed that St. Matthew achieved this.
- ► The science laboratory was established through our congregation's financial assistance in 2018.



<u>Impacto Ministry</u>, Guatemala: The St. Matthew's 2021 mission trip is canceled. Please pray for the people of Guatemala—very few have been vaccinated. Check out <u>May 2021 What's Happening</u>.

Mission Central Hub:

- Provided Hand Sanitizer and Foaming Hand Soap to <u>GiGi's Playhouse</u>, a non-profit that provides free educational and therapeutic programs to individuals with Down Syndrome of all ages and their families.
- Churches working together to help our communities:
 - Faith UMC in Rockville gave us over 250 children's books, which we provided to Laurel Elementary School (a Title I school), along with some sunscreen, which Principal Melinda Lee picked up (pictured to the right).
 - St. Matthew's forwarded two boxes of books from Mission Central to Glenelg UMC for donation to a Title I School in their area.
 - Faith UMC in Rockville sent 100 Cleaning Buckets and Parish Nurses of Huntingtown UMC sent 60 Hygiene Kits.

The communion offering for the month of July will go to support our Children and Youth Ministries.


Once a month, St. Matthew's provides the Sunday evening meal for the Prince George's House Shelter for Homeless Men.





Finance Report: St. Matthew's Finances at a Glance




ST. MATTHEW'S FINANCES IN GRAPHS (May 2021)




GOAL: Operating income should be greater than or at least equal to operating expenses
