Administrative Council Update from December 2024

Please note that Administrative Council

Financial Status

Offerings were \$70.9K, which is \$22.2K over budget for the month. YTD total income is \$1,021.5K, which is \$193.8K over budget. Total expenses for the month were \$71.5K, which is \$2.4K over budget for the month. Apportionment is current. YTD total expense is \$806.0K, which is \$23.4K under budget, excluding capital improvements.

There was an operating gain of \$12.9K for the month, including a \$73.5K grant reimbursement, with a YTD operating gain of \$215.5K (including grants and budgeted transfers from investments).

Investments decreased by \$16.0K last month to \$619.3K. For the year, the investment account decreased \$14.5K from \$633.8K. \$68.0K were transferred from investments in May.



The average weekly attendance last month was 158 which is up from 143 the previous month. Average weekly attendance last year was 140.

Overall, the year turned out well financially (\$215.5K operating gain), despite the original budget projecting a deficit.

Outreach Position

As mentioned last month, the Administrative Council voted to accept the grant funding a new staff member focused on outreach. We signed the grant paperwork this month. SPPRC will be finalizing the position description with the hope that we can hire someone in the first quarter of 2025.

2025 Budget

As mentioned last month, the 2025 Budget is currently projected to have a \$95K deficit (made more tolerable by the 2024 surplus). There are some areas where we hope to have some significant savings this year. The Trustees are investigating these areas; we have no updates on this so far but will keep the congregation apprised.

Adult Studies


Bible Studies in Full Swing




End of Year: St. Matthew's Finances at a Glance














Top 5 Mission Fund Donations Received Year-to-Date
