Administrative Council Update from April 2025

Please note that Administrative Council meetings are open to the congregation, even when we are holding them via Zoom during times of COVID precaution. If you wish to attend, please contact Chuck Hastings for Zoom details; however, be advised that discussion and voting are limited to Ad Council members. The Administrative Council did not meet in April since the meeting night fell during Holy Week.

Financial Status for March 2025

Offerings were \$49.7K, which is \$1.1K under budget for the month. YTD total income is \$192.8K, which is \$0.2K under budget. Total expenses for the month were \$69.1K, which is \$2.9K under budget for the month. Apportionment is current. YTD total expense is \$205.7K, which is \$10.2K under budget, excluding capital improvements.

There was an operating gain of \$53.9K for the month, with a YTD operating gain of \$60.1K (including grants and budgeted transfers from investments).



Investments decreased by \$20.7K last month to \$608.8K. For the year, the investment account decreased \$10.5K from \$619.3K. No funds have been transferred from the investment account so far this year.

The average weekly attendance last month was 139, which is down from 143 the previous month. Average weekly attendance last year was 137.

universities, and all (local, regional, national, and international) mission efforts.




Christian Book Club



UMCOR and Our Church

On March 30, we celebrated UMCOR Sunday with a mission moment by Rod Berfield and a booth during Coffee Hour about United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) and St. Matthew's UMC support to UMCOR.



UMCOR is the worldwide humanitarian arm of the UMC and has been relieving human suffering for more than 80 years. UMCOR provides relief when war, conflict or natural disaster disrupts life to such an extent that communities cannot recover on their own. UMCOR journeys with affected communities throughout a disaster's cycle, including disaster preparedness, relief, response, recovery and mitigation.

In 2024, UMCOR responded to 137 humanitarian crises around the world. Learn more about UMCOR's 2024 responses <u>In Times of Crisis</u>, in <u>Places of Need—You Make Recovery Possible</u> (UMCOR, 27 Feb 2025).

UMCOR is currently responding to very recent disasters. Some examples include U.S. wildfires in eastern and western U.S., severe flooding and storms in the southeastern, central, and western U.S., and, worldwide, the 7.7 magnitude earthquake in Myanmar and flooding in the Congo. They remain engaged in communities whose disasters are no longer in the news. UMCOR's Facebook page provides updates on their ongoing efforts.

St Matthew's supports UMCOR throughout the year by providing monetary donations and disaster awareness as well as facilitating UMCOR Kits (e.g., flood buckets and hygiene kits) getting to Mission Central in Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania via our Mission Central Hub. Mission Central is the largest of seven warehouses within the UMCOR Disaster Relief Network. As one of four Point of Delivery locations for the Baltimore Washington Conference Disaster Ministry, we collect, verify and provide logistics and transportation support to shepherd the kits built by us and other regional congregations to Mission Central.

To learn more about BWC Disaster response and meet Thea Beaton, who leads this ministry and is a UMC Level Disaster Response Coordinator, watch UMCOR Partnerships with US Annual Conference. Thea gives the third testimonial.

From January 2024 to March 2025, St Matthew's provided:

- UMCOR Sunday offerings of \$470 in 2024 and \$420 in 2025;
- UMCOR's Greatest Need donations of \$3,405;
- UMCOR's Disaster Response for US/National Support of \$1,500 budgeted church funds;
- 1,900+ UMCOR hygiene kits and flood buckets from 15+ churches.

In the upcoming June Circuit Rider, look for more information about our Mission Central Hub, our UMCOR support, and our Hub's impact in the last 18 months.




Finance Report: St. Matthew's Finances at a Glance


ST. MATTHEW'S FINANCE CHARTS (MAR 2025)




Investment Account Balances & Drawdowns




Top 5 Mission Fund Donations Received Year-to-Date




Average Weekly Offering & Sunday Attendance with Trendlines
